3. Committee: General Government and Capital Outlay

4. Title: Relief; Keith Allen Harward.

5. Summary: Provides relief in the amount of \$1,450,000 to Mr. Harward, who spent 33 years in prison for crimes he did not commit after being convicted on March 6, 1986, of first degree murder and sentenced to life in prison. In late 2015 and early 2016 the Department of Forensic Sciences analyzed DNA evidence from a rape kit collected from the victim after the crime and excluded Mr. Harward as the perpetrator of the crime. This analysis identified the real perpetrator of the crime as Jerry Crotty, who had died in an Ohio prison in 2006. On April 7, 2016, the Supreme Court of Virginia granted Mr. Howard's Writ of Actual Innocence, formally exonerating him of all the crimes for which he had been convicted.

Mr. Harward's relief would be paid as follows: (i) an initial lump sum of \$290,000 to be paid within 60 days immediately following the execution of a release by Mr. Harward from any present or future claims he may have and (ii) the sum of \$1,160,000 to purchase an annuity for the primary benefit of Mr. Harward with the terms structured in his best interests.
