2. Patron: Rush

3. Committee: Passed Both Houses

4. Title: Alcoholic beverage control; retail on-premises license for nonprofit historic cinema houses.

5. Summary: Creates a new retail on-premises wine and beer license for nonprofit historic cinema houses. The bill defines "historic cinema house" and sets out the privileges of the license and imposes a \$200 annual state license tax and a \$20 annual local license tax.

8. Fiscal Implications: According to data obtained from the Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC), it is estimated that roughly 100 establishments in the Commonwealth would qualify for licensure under the proposed definition of "historic cinema house." Because the number of applicants seeking a new license as a result of this proposal is unknown, the fiscal operational impact is indeterminate. Any new cost from this legislation would be defrayed in part by additional revenue. Based on 100 new licenses, the estimated revenue generated from this legislation is \$28,500 the first year, and \$22,200 the second year. The first year revenue amount is higher due to the initial \$65 per license application fee that would be required.
