- 3. Committee: Agriculture, Chesapeake and Natural Resources
- **4. Title:** Care of companion animals; tethering; penalty.
- **5. Summary:** This bill prohibits tethering of companion animals outdoors unless the owner is outdoors within sight of the animal. A violation of this prohibition is a Class 4 misdemeanor and a second or subsequent violation is a Class 3 misdemeanor.
- 6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.
- 7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Preliminary.
- 8. Fiscal Implications: It is anticipated that this bill will not have a fiscal impact on the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, as local animal control officers will be responsible for enforcing the provisions. As such, the bill may have a fiscal impact on localities.

Violations of the provision result in Class 4 misdemeanors for first offenses, and Class 3 misdemeanors for second or subsequent violations. These misdemeanors may result in fines. The number of violations cannot be determined. All revenue from fines is deposited to the state Literary Fund.
