**4. Title:** School boards; instructional and support personnel; additional funding.

**5. Summary:** Declares it the policy of the Commonwealth that school boards that struggle to attract and retain qualified instructional and support personnel in the school division shall receive, to the extent practicable, funds for instructional and support personnel in addition to those state funds that the school board otherwise receives for public school purposes.

**6. Budget Amendment Necessary:** No.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** This bill declares it the policy of the Commonwealth that school boards that struggle to attract and retain qualified instructional and support personnel in the school divisions shall receive funds for instructional and support personnel in addition to those state funds that the school board receives for public school purposes pursuant to § 22.1-88, Code of Virginia; however, the bill does not indicate that the Commonwealth is responsible for providing these additional funds. Furthermore, the bill does not identify a source of funding or a methodology by which to calculate additional funding that school boards struggling to attract and retain qualified instructional and support personnel should receive. As written, there is no anticipated state fiscal impact resulting from the provisions of this bill.
