4. Title: Model policy regarding officer-involved deaths; community-policing programs and training standards

5. Summary: This bill requires the Department of Criminal Justice Services to establish a model policy regarding the independent review of all officer-involved shootings. The bill also requires that the Department periodically review community-policing programs and establish training standards to ensure sensitivity to and awareness of persons who have a mental illness, substance abuse addiction, or developmental disability.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Preliminary, See Item 8

8. Fiscal Implications: The requirements established by this bill already exist within the minimum compulsory training standards for basic training under the Department of Criminal Justice Services. The Department can implement the requirements of the bill with existing resources.

Independent and regional training academies will need to update their training curriculum and materials to satisfy the requirements of this bill. A statutory requirement that officers receive this training for recertification may increase the number of in-service training hours required, which is currently 40 hours every two years. Training academies and law enforcement agencies could face increased costs related to increased training hours and securing qualified instructors to provide officers' in-service training.

9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected: Independent and regional training academies, local law-enforcement agencies, and the Department of Criminal Justice Services

10. Technical Amendment Necessary: No

11. Other Comments: Regulatory action will be required to amend current regulations related to in-service training.
