**4. Title:** Licensure of facilities operated by agencies of the Commonwealth.

**5. Summary:** Provides for licensure of assisted living facilities, adult day care centers, and child welfare agencies operated by the agencies of the Commonwealth.

**6. Budget Amendment Necessary:** No.

**7. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** See Item 8.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** This legislation provides the authority for the Department of Social Services to license assisted living facilities, adult day centers, and child welfare agencies operated by agencies of the Commonwealth. Additionally, it provides an appeals process for enforcement actions for these programs.

Currently, child day centers and adult care programs operated by state agencies are not subject to nor eligible for Department licensure. However, many of the child day center programs operated by state agencies need to be licensed in order to be eligible for U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) programs, federal Child Care Development Fund (CCDF) grant subsidy payments, credentialing, and quality ratings. In addition, many of the adult programs operated by state agencies need to be licensed in order to work with certain clients.

The Department is currently aware of 14 programs that would be affected by this bill. While this legislation will expand the Department's authority and service population, any increase in workload resulting from this bill can be absorbed within current appropriation and staffing levels. Any revenue impact would be negligible.

**9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected:** Department of Social Services, Department of Aging and Rehabilitative Services, any state agency operating an assisted living facility, adult day center, or child welfare agency.
