4. Title: Secretary of Transportation to convene a task force to study the feasibility of establishing a statewide one-stop online portal for address changes; report

5. Summary: This bill requires the Secretary of Transportation to convene a task force of state agencies to study the feasibility of establishing a one-stop online portal for citizen address changes in order to develop a single statewide address database for utilization by state entities. The task force shall submit to the Governor and the General Assembly a report on its findings and recommendations by November 1, 2017. The bill has a sunset of July 1, 2018.

8. Fiscal Implications: The costs for this task force will revolve around staff time devoted to researching possible options for a one-stop online portal for citizen address changes and attending meetings, as well as any member costs (travel, food, etc.) associated with the meetings of the task force. It is anticipated that these costs can be absorbed within existing agencies' resources.

Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected: Secretary of Transportation, Supreme Court, Department of Motor Vehicles, Department of Elections, Department of Taxation, Department of Health, Department of Medical Assistance Services, Virginia Information Technologies Agency, Department of Game and Inland Fisheries, Department of Social Services, Clerks of Circuit Court, and any other state agency that collects citizen addresses.
