3. Committee: Education and Health

4. Title: Temporary detention order; minimum time period for person to be held.

5. Summary: This bill provides that a person held pursuant to a temporary detention order shall be held for up to 24 hours once admitted to the facility, as determined by the treating physician at such facility, to be reasonably necessary. Currently, a person may be held pursuant to a temporary detention order for up to 72 hours, but there is no requirement that a person subject to such order be held for any minimum time period.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Indeterminate

8. Fiscal Implications: The bill cannot be analyzed for fiscal impact as it appears to contain an internal conflict. The bill, as drafted, sets a maximum of 24 hours for mental health treatment under a TDO which conflicts with existing language in the same statute that limits mental health treatment under a TDO to 72 hours.
