**4. Title:** Applicant Fingerprint Database; Federal Bureau of Investigation records.

**5. Summary:** The bill authorizes the Department of State Police to submit fingerprints and accompanying records to the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) to be advised through the FBI's Next Generation Identification Rap Back service when an individual subject to a criminal background check is arrested for, or convicted of, a criminal offense not reported to the Department which would disqualify that individual from licensure, certification, employment, or volunteer service with that entity.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** The Rap Back service allows authorized agencies to receive notification of criminal activity on individuals who hold positions of trust (e.g. school teachers, daycare workers) or who are under criminal justice supervision or investigation, thus eliminating the need for repeated background checks on a person from the same applicant agency. The bill is not expected to have a fiscal impact on the Department of State Police.
