5. Summary: Raises the vehicle registration fee by \$1.25 on each July 1 from 2017 through 2026 for a total cumulative increase of \$12.50 above current registration fees. The revenue is allocated to the Department of State Police.

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8. Fiscal Implications: The legislation would raise the base fee for vehicle registration fees by \$1.25 each July from 2017 through 2026. The cumulative increase in the fee, as of July 1, 2026, would be \$12.50. Currently, the base fee for most private passenger cars is either \$33 (for vehicles weighing 4,000 pounds or less) or \$38 (for vehicles weighing more). Current registration fees also include \$1.50 for the motor vehicle inspection program and \$6.25 to support emergency medical services, for a total of \$40.75 (or \$45.75 for heavier vehicles). The proposed legislation would ultimately result in a total registration fee of \$53.25 (\$58.25 for heavier vehicles) in 2026.

A) The revenue collected as a result of this legislation would be allocated to the Department of State Police. The Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) has reported that 8,101,136 vehicles were registered in 2016. The DMV assumes the number of vehicle registrations increases by two percent a year. Under these assumptions, the proposed legislation would generate an estimated \$123.4 million a year by 2026 for the Department of State Police.

B) According to the Department of Motor Vehicles, the bill is estimated to create costs for the agency. Approximately 48.4 percent of registration renewals are paid with credit card. The DMV pays two percent of the cost of each credit card transaction as a merchant fee. Accordingly, for each \$1.25 added to any registration transaction, the additional cost to DMV in merchant fees would be \$0.025. Because the legislation would allocate the full amount of the revenue generated from the fee increase to the Department of State Police, DMV will not retain any portion to cover the additional merchant fees associated with the higher registration fees paid by credit cards. The estimated additional merchant fees are summarized below.

C) According to DMV, it will also incur costs associated with DMV Select Offices. As per Item 442.D. of Chapter 780, 2016 Acts of Assembly, DMV Select Agents receive 4.5 percent of gross collections of fees for the first \$500,000 and five percent of all gross collections of fees in excess of \$500,000 made by the entity during each fiscal year. According to the agency, approximately 8.8 percent of vehicle registration renewals are conducted by Select agents. According to these assumptions, this legislation could create the following additional costs for DMV.
