4. Title: Limits in-state tuition increases to medium household (family) income in Virginia

5. Summary: The proposed legislation prohibits any percentage increase in in-state tuition or instructional fees for undergraduate students at Virginia's public institutions of higher education that exceeds the annual percentage increase, as determined by the State Council of Higher Education for Virginia, of the median household income in the Commonwealth established by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, of the calendar year immediately preceding the affected year.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Indeterminate. (See Line 8)

8. Fiscal Implications: Over the past decade, the median household income in the Commonwealth established by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development varied in growth from -2.8 percent to 2.9 percent. Tuition and mandatory E&G fees charges ranged from 4.5 percent to 13.1 percent over the same timeframe if the requirements of this legislation had been in place over the last decade, higher education institutions would have had less tuition and fee revenue to address enrollment growth, general fund budget reductions, and increasing operating and maintenance expenses, such as rising utilities, salary and benefit costs.

Public institutions of higher education

10. Technical Amendment Necessary: The legislation may consider a technical correction to change median "household" income to median "family" income because "household income" can include non-family members.
