| 8  | Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:   |
| 9  | 1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Article 1 of Chapter 29 of Title 54.1 a             |
| 10 | section numbered 54.1-2910.4 as follows:   |
| 11 | § 54.1-2910.4. Health record retention.  |
| 12 | Practitioners licensed under this chapter shall maintain health records, as defined in                   |
| 13 | § 32.1-127.1:03, for a minimum of six years following the last patient encounter. However, such          |
| 14 | practitioners are not required to maintain health records for longer than 12 years from the date of      |
| 15 | creation except for (i) health records of a minor child, including immunizations, which shall be         |
| 16 | maintained until the child reaches the age of 18 or becomes emancipated, with a minimum time for         |
| 17 | record retention of six years from the last patient encounter regardless of the age of the child or (ii) |
| 18 | health records that are required by contractual obligation or federal law to be maintained for a longer  |
| 19 | period of time. Health records that have previously been transferred to another practitioner or health   |
| 20 | care provider or provided to the patient or his personal representative are not required to be           |

21 maintained beyond such transfer or provision.

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
