VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to authorize the issuance of bonds, in an amount up to \$21,000,000 plus financing costs, 3 pursuant to Article X, Section 9 (c) of the Constitution of Virginia, for paying costs of acquiring, 4 constructing, and equipping revenue-producing capital projects at institutions of higher education of 5 the Commonwealth; to authorize the Treasury Board, by and with the consent of the Governor, to fix 6 the details of such bonds, to provide for the sale of such bonds, and to issue notes to borrow money 7 in anticipation of the issuance of the bonds; to provide for the pledge of the net revenues of such 8 capital projects and the full faith, credit, and taxing power of the Commonwealth for the payment of 9 such bonds; and to provide that the interest income on such bonds and notes shall be exempt from 10 all taxation by the Commonwealth and any political subdivision thereof.

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Whereas, Article X, Section 9 (c) of the Constitution of Virginia provides that the General Assembly 13 14 may authorize the creation of debt secured by a pledge of net revenues derived from rates, fees, or other 15 charges and the full faith and credit of the Commonwealth of Virginia, provided that such debt is created for specific revenue-producing capital projects, including their enlargement or improvement, at, 16 among others, institutions of higher education of the Commonwealth; and 17

18 Whereas, in accordance with Article X, Section 9 (c) of the Constitution of Virginia, the Governor 19 has certified in writing, filed with the Auditor of Public Accounts, his opinion that the anticipated net revenues of each of the capital projects identified below to be pledged to the payment of the principal of 20 21 and the interest on that portion of such debt issued for each such project will be sufficient to meet such 22 payments as the same become due and to provide such reserves as may be required by law and that 23 each of the capital projects complies with the requirements of Article X, Section 9 (c) of the 24 Constitution of Virginia; now, therefore, 25

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

26 **1.** §1. Title.

27 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Commonwealth of Virginia Institutions of Higher 28 Education Bond Act of 2018.' 29

§ 2. Authorization of bonds and bond anticipation notes.

The Treasury Board is hereby authorized, by and with the consent of the Governor, to sell and issue, 30 31 pursuant to Article X, Section 9 (c) of the Constitution of Virginia, at one time or from time to time, 32 bonds of the Commonwealth, to be designated "Commonwealth of Virginia Institutions of Higher Education Bonds, Series" in an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$21,000,000, plus 33 34 amounts needed to fund issuance costs, reserve funds, construction period interest, and other financing 35 expenses. The Treasury Board is further hereby authorized, by and with the consent of the Governor, to borrow money in anticipation of the issuance of bonds by the issuance of bond anticipation notes 36 37 (BANs), including BANs issued as commercial paper. The proceeds of such bonds and BANs, excluding 38 amounts needed to fund issuance costs, reserve funds, and other financing expenses, shall be used 39 exclusively for the purpose of providing funds, with any other available funds, for paying all or a 40 portion of the costs of acquiring, constructing, renovating, enlarging, improving, and equipping 41 revenue-producing capital projects at institutions of higher education of the Commonwealth as follows:

46	§ 3. Application of proceeds.		

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47 The proceeds, including any premium, of bonds and BANs (except the proceeds of (i) bonds the 48 issuance of which has been anticipated by BANs, (ii) refunding bonds, and (iii) refunding BANs), shall 49 be deposited in a special capital outlay fund in the state treasury and, together with the investment 50 income thereon, shall be disbursed by the State Treasurer for paying costs of acquiring, constructing, renovating, enlarging, improving, and equipping the authorized capital projects, including financing 51 costs. The proceeds of (i) bonds the issuance of which has been anticipated by BANs, (ii) refunding 52 bonds, and (iii) refunding BANs shall be used to pay such BANs, refunded bonds, and refunded BANs. 53 54

§ 4. Details, sale of bonds and BANs.

55 Bonds and BANs shall be dated and may be made redeemable before their maturity or maturities at 56 such price or prices or within such price parameters, all as may be determined by the Treasury Board,

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57 by and with the consent of the Governor. Bonds and BANs shall be in such form, shall bear interest at 58 such rate or rates, either at fixed rates or at rates established by formula or other method, and may 59 contain such other provisions, all as determined by the Treasury Board or, when authorized by the 60 Treasury Board, the State Treasurer. The principal of and premium, if any, and the interest on bonds 61 and BANs shall be payable in lawful money of the United States of America. Bonds and BANs may be 62 certificated or uncertificated as determined by the Treasury Board. The Treasury Board may contract 63 for services of such registrars, transfer agents, or other authenticating agents as it deems appropriate to 64 maintain a record of the persons entitled to the bonds and BANs. Bonds and BANs issued in certificated 65 form may be issued under a system of book entry for recording the ownership and transfer of ownership of rights to receive payments on the bonds and BANs. The Treasury Board shall fix the authorized 66 67 denomination or denominations of the bonds and the place or places of payment of certificated bonds and BANs, which may be at the Office of the State Treasurer or at any bank or trust company within or 68 without the Commonwealth. Bonds shall mature at such time or times not exceeding 30 years from their 69 70 date or dates, and BANs shall mature at such time or times not exceeding five years from their date or 71 dates.

72 The Treasury Board may sell bonds and BANs in such manner, by competitive bidding, negotiated 73 sale, or private placement, and for such price or within such price parameters as it may determine, by 74 and with the consent of the Governor, to be in the best interest of the Commonwealth.

75 In the discretion of the Treasury Board, bonds and BANs may be issued at one time or from time to 76 time and may be sold and issued at the same time with other general obligation bonds and BANs, 77 respectively, of the Commonwealth authorized pursuant to Article X, Section 9 (a) (3), (b), and (c) of 78 the Constitution of Virginia, as separate issues or as a combined issue, designated "Commonwealth of 79 Virginia General Obligation Bonds Bond Anticipation Notes, Series." 80

§ 5. Execution of bonds and BANs.

Certificated bonds and BANs shall be signed on behalf of the Commonwealth by the Governor and 81 by the State Treasurer, or shall bear their facsimile signatures, and shall bear the lesser seal of the 82 83 Commonwealth or a facsimile thereof. If the bonds or BANs bear the facsimile signature of the State 84 Treasurer, they shall be signed by such administrative assistant as the State Treasurer shall determine 85 or by such registrar or paying agent as may be designated to sign them by the Treasury Board. If any officer whose signature or facsimile signature appears on any bonds or BANs ceases to be such officer 86 before delivery, such signature or facsimile signature shall nevertheless be valid and sufficient for all 87 88 purposes the same as if such officer had remained in office until such delivery, and any bond or BAN 89 may bear the facsimile signature of, or may be signed by, such persons as at the actual time of 90 execution are the proper officers to sign such bond or BAN, although at the date of such bond or BAN, 91 such persons may not have been such officers.

92 § 6. Sources for payment of expenses.

93 All expenses incurred under this act shall be paid from the proceeds of bonds or BANs, from 94 payments made by the institutions for which the capital projects were authorized in § 2, or from any 95 other available funds as the Treasury Board shall determine. 96

§ 7. Revenues.

97 Each institution of higher education named in § 2 is hereby authorized (i) to fix, revise, charge, and 98 collect rates, fees, and charges for or in connection with the use, occupancy, and services of each 99 capital project named in § 2 or the system of which such capital project is a part and (ii) to pledge to 100 the portion of the bonds or BANs issued for such capital project the net revenues resulting from such 101 rates, fees, and charges and remaining after payment of the expenses of operating the project or system, 102 as the case may be. The institution is further authorized to create debt service and sinking funds for the 103 payments of the principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the bonds and other reserves required by 104 any agency of the United States of America purchasing the bonds or any portion thereof. 105

§ 8. Investments and contracts.

106 A. Pending the application of the proceeds of the bonds or BANs (including refunding bonds and 107 BANs) to the purpose for which they have been authorized and the application of funds set aside for the 108 purpose to the payment of bonds or BANs, they may be invested by the State Treasurer in securities that 109 are legal investments under the laws of the Commonwealth for public funds and sinking funds, as the 110 case may be. Whenever the State Treasurer receives interest from the investment of the proceeds of 111 bonds or any BANs, such interest shall become a part of the principal of the bonds or any BANs and 112 shall be used in the same manner as required for principal of the bonds or BANs.

113 B. The Commonwealth may enter into any contract or other arrangement that is determined to be 114 necessary or appropriate to place the obligation or investment of the Commonwealth, as represented by 115 bonds, BANs, or investments, in whole or in part, on the interest rate, cash flow, or other basis desired by the Commonwealth. Such contract or other arrangement may include, without limitation, contracts 116 commonly known as interest rate swap agreements and futures or contracts providing for payments 117

118 based on levels of, or changes in, interest rates. These contracts or arrangements may be entered into 119 by the Commonwealth in connection with, or incidental to, entering into, or maintaining any (i) 120 agreement that secures bonds or BANs or (ii) investment, or contract providing for investment, otherwise authorized by law. These contracts and arrangements may contain such payment, security, 121 122 default, remedy, and other terms and conditions as determined by the Commonwealth, after giving due 123 consideration to the creditworthiness of the counterparty or other obligated party, including any rating 124 by any nationally recognized rating agency, and any other criteria as may be appropriate. The 125 determinations referred to in this subsection may be made by the Treasury Board or any public funds 126 manager with professional investment capabilities duly authorized by the Treasury Board to make such 127 determinations.

128 C. Any money set aside and pledged to secure payments of bonds, BANs, or any of the contracts 129 entered into pursuant to this section may be invested in accordance with subsection A and may be 130 pledged to and used to service any of the contracts or other arrangements entered into pursuant to 131 subsection B.

§ 9. Security for bonds and BANs.

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133 The net revenues of the capital projects set forth above and the full faith and credit of the 134 Commonwealth are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment of the principal of and the interest on 135 bonds and BANs (unless the Treasury Board, by and with the consent of the Governor, shall provide 136 otherwise) issued under this act. The proceeds of (i) bonds the issuance of which has been anticipated 137 by BANs, (ii) refunding bonds, and (iii) refunding BANs are hereby irrevocably pledged for the payment 138 of principal of and interest and any premium on the BANs or bonds to be paid or redeemed thereby. In 139 the event the net revenues pledged to the payment of the bonds or BANs are insufficient in any fiscal 140 year for the timely payment of the principal of, premium, if any, and interest on the bonds or BANs, 141 where the full faith and credit of the Commonwealth have been pledged, the General Assembly shall 142 appropriate a sum sufficient therefor or the Governor shall direct payment therefor from the general 143 fund revenues of the Commonwealth. 144

§ 10. Exemption of interest from tax.

145 The bonds and BANs issued under the provisions of this act, their transfer and the income therefrom, 146 including any profit made on the sale thereof, shall at all times be free and exempt from taxation by the 147 Commonwealth and by any county, city, or town, or other political subdivision thereof. The Treasury 148 Board is authorized to take or refrain from taking any and all actions and to covenant to such effect, 149 and to require the participating institutions to do and to covenant likewise, to the extent that, in the 150 judgment of the Treasury Board, it is appropriate in order that interest on the bonds and BANs may be 151 exempt from federal income tax. Alternatively, interest on bonds and BANs may be made subject to 152 inclusion in gross income of the holders thereof for federal income tax purposes.

153 § 11. Refunding bonds and BANs.

154 The Treasury Board is authorized, by and with the consent of the Governor, to sell and issue, at one 155 time or from time to time, refunding bonds and BANs of the Commonwealth and to refund any or all of the bonds and BANs, respectively, issued under this act or otherwise authorized pursuant to Article X, 156 157 Section 9 (c) of the Constitution of Virginia. Refunding bonds and BANs may be issued in a principal 158 amount up to the amount necessary to pay at maturity or redeem the bonds and BANs to be refunded 159 and pay all issuance costs and other financing expenses of the refunding. Such refunding bonds and 160 BANs may be issued whether or not the obligations to be refunded are then subject to redemption. 161 § 12. Defeasance.

162 Any bond or BAN for which cash or direct obligations of the United States of America shall have been set aside in escrow with the State Treasurer or a bank or trust company, within or without the 163 164 Commonwealth, shall be deemed no longer outstanding under the applicable authorizing instrument, this 165 act, and Article X, Section 9 (c) or (b), as the case may be, of the Constitution of Virginia.

166 § 13. Severability.

167 The provisions of this act or the application thereof to any person or circumstance that are held 168 invalid shall not affect the validity of other provisions or applications of this act which can be given 169 effect without the invalid provisions or applications.

170 2. That an emergency exists and this act is in force from its passage.
