10	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
11	1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding a section numbered 32.1-111.4:9 as follows:
12	§ 32.1-111.4:9. Notice requirements for emergency air medical transportation.
13	A. Before emergency medical services personnel initiate contact with an emergency air medical
14	transportation provider for air transport of a patient, the emergency medical services personnel shall
15	obtain written consent from the patient to receive emergency air medical transportation services after
16	providing the patient with the following information for the purpose of allowing the patient to make an
17	informed decision on choosing a form of transportation:
18	1. The patient will be responsible for any payments due for the emergency air medical transportation
19	services;
20 21	2. The emergency air medical transportation provider might not have contracts with the patient's health care insurer and, therefore, services provided to the patient by such emergency air medical
21 22	transportation provider may be considered out-of-network services and not covered under the patient's
23	insurance plan; and
23 24	3. A description of the range of charges that the patient may incur for such emergency air medical
25	transportation services.
26 26	B. Emergency medical services personnel shall be exempt from complying with the provisions of
27	subsection A if the emergency medical services personnel determine and document that, due to
