	AMENDMENT IN THE NATURE OF A SUBSTITUTE

6	Requesting Christopher Newport University to study the feasibility and merits of a state-run retirement
7	savings plan for Virginia employers and their employees who do not have access to an
8	employer-provided retirement savings plan. Report.
9	WHEREAS, thirty-four percent of employees have no access to a retirement savings plan sponsored
10	by their employers; and
11	WHEREAS, as average life expectancies in the United States have risen to 76 years for men and 81
12	years for women, people need retirement savings to last longer than in the past; and
13	WHEREAS, the increased costs of medical care, home health care services, and nursing home stays
14	will require greater shares of retirement savings; and
15	WHEREAS, Maryland and four other states have established state-run retirement savings plans for
16	employees without access to employer-provided plans; now, therefore, be it
17	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That Christopher Newport University
18	be requested to study the feasibility and merits of a state-run retirement savings plan for Virginia
19 20	employers and their employees who do not have access to an employer-provided retirement savings
20	plan.
21 22	In conducting its study, Christopher Newport University (the University) shall (i) examine the role of
22 23	employers in providing retirement plans for their employees; (ii) recommend whether such a plan should
23 24	be administered by an existing state agency or a newly created agency; (iii) consider and recommend funding sources for such a plan; and (iv) solicit input from all stakeholders.
25	All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the University for this study, upon
2 6	request. The University may contract with a nonprofit organization to assist it in carrying out this study,
20 27	as it deems appropriate. If the University is unable to secure funding for this study, it shall not conduct
28	the study but shall report to the General Assembly before proceeding.
29	The University shall complete its meetings by November 30, 2018, and shall submit to the Governor
30	and the General Assembly an executive summary and a report of its findings and recommendations for
31	publication as a House or Senate document. The executive summary and report shall be submitted as
32	provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of
33	legislative documents and reports no later than the first day of the 2019 Regular Session of the General
34	Assembly and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.

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
