That § 2.2-2101 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted and the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Chapter 25 of Title 2.2 an article numbered 10, consisting of sections 13 14 numbered 2.2-2537 through 2.2-2543, as follows: § 2.2-2101. Prohibition against service by legislators on boards, commissions, and councils 15 16 within the executive branch; exceptions. Members of the General Assembly shall be ineligible to serve on boards, commissions, and councils 17 18 within the executive branch of state government who are responsible for administering programs established by the General Assembly. Such prohibition shall not extend to boards, commissions, and 19 20 councils engaged solely in policy studies or commemorative activities. Henrietta Lacks Commission.

§ 2.2-2537. Henrietta Lacks Commission; purpose.

55 The Henrietta Lacks Commission (the Commission) is established as an advisory commission in the executive branch of state government. The purpose of the Commission is to sustain the legacy of the 56 life-changing contribution of Henrietta Lacks to medical science by advancing cancer research and 57 58 treatment through the creation of a biomedical research and data center.

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59 § 2.2-2538. Membership; terms; vacancies; chairman and vice-chairman.

60 A. The Commission shall consist of nine members that include two legislative members, three 61 nonlegislative citizen members, and three ex officio members. Members shall be appointed as follows: (i) 62 one member of the House of Delegates to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates in 63 accordance with the principles of proportional representation contained in the Rules of the House of 64 Delegates; (ii) one member of the Senate to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules; and (iii) 65 one nonlegislative citizen member who is a member of the extended family of Henrietta Lacks, one nonlegislative citizen member who is a member of the Board of Directors of the Henrietta Lacks Legacy 66 Group, and one nonlegislative citizen member who is a member of the Halifax County Industrial 67 Development Authority to be appointed by the Governor. The mayor of the Town of South Boston, the **68** chair of the Board of Supervisors of Halifax County, the Executive Director of the Southern Virginia 69 70 Higher Education Center, and the Executive Director of the Halifax County Industrial Development 71 Authority, or their designees, shall serve ex officio with voting privileges. Nonlegislative citizen members of the Commission shall be citizens of the Commonwealth. Unless otherwise approved in writing by the 72 73 chairman of the Commission and the respective Clerk, nonlegislative citizen members shall only be 74 reimbursed for lodging and travel originating or ending within the Commonwealth of Virginia for the 75 purpose of attending meetings.

76 B. Legislative members and ex officio members of the Commission shall serve terms coincident with 77 their terms of office. Nonlegislative citizen members shall be appointed for a term of two years. 78 Appointments to fill vacancies, other than by expiration of a term, shall be for the unexpired terms. Legislative members and nonlegislative citizen members may be reappointed. However, no nonlegislative 79 80 citizen member shall serve more than four consecutive two-year terms. The remainder of any term to which a member is appointed to fill a vacancy shall not constitute a term in determining the member's 81 82 eligibility for reappointment. Vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointments. 83

C. The Commission shall elect a chairman and vice-chairman from among its membership. 84

§ 2.2-2539. Quorum; meetings; voting on recommendations.

85 A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum. The meetings of the Commission shall be held 86 at the call of the chairman or whenever a majority of the members so request.

87 § 2.2-2540. Compensation; expenses.

88 Legislative members of the Commission shall receive such compensation as provided in § 30-19.12, 89 and nonlegislative citizen members shall receive such compensation for the performance of their duties 90 as provided in § 2.2-2813. All members shall be reimbursed for reasonable and necessary expenses 91 incurred in the performance of their duties as provided in §§ 2.2-2813 and 2.2-2825. Compensation to 92 members of the General Assembly for attendance at official meetings of the Commission shall be paid by the offices of the Clerk of the House of Delegates or Clerk of the Senate, as applicable. All other compensation and expenses shall be paid from existing appropriations to the Commission or, if 93 94 95 unfunded, shall be approved by the Joint Rules Committee. 96

§ 2.2-2541. Powers and duties of the Commission.

The Commission shall have the power and duty to:

98 1. Establish a public-private partnership to create the Henrietta Lacks Life Sciences Center as a 99 cancer research and treatment center located in Halifax County and designed to (i) transform and 100 accelerate cancer research and treatment through the use of biodata tools, (ii) provide tailored cancer 101 treatment medicine to an underserved portion of rural Southside Virginia, and (iii) incubate new biotech 102 businesses across the Southside Virginia region; and

103 2. Submit to the Governor and the General Assembly an annual report for publication as a report 104 document as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents and reports. The chairman of the Commission shall submit to the 105 Governor and the General Assembly an annual executive summary of the interim activity and work of 106 107 the Commission no later than the first day of each regular session of the General Assembly. The 108 executive summary shall be submitted for publication as a report document as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative documents 109 110 and reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website. 111

§ 2.2-2542. Staffing; cooperation of agencies of state and local governments.

The Department of Health shall provide staff support to the Commission. Every department, division, 112 113 board, bureau, commission, authority, or political subdivision of the Commonwealth shall cooperate with, and provide assistance to, the Commission, upon request. 114
