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VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend and reenact § 4.1-208 of the Code of Virginia, relating to alcoholic beverage control;
 3 sales by brewery on licensed premises.

6 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

7 1. That § 4.1-208 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: § 4.1-208. Beer licenses.

A. The Board may grant the following licenses relating to beer:

10 1. Brewery licenses, which shall authorize the licensee to manufacture beer and to sell and deliver or ship the beer so manufactured, in accordance with Board regulations, in closed containers to (i) persons 11 licensed to sell the beer at wholesale; (ii) persons licensed to sell beer at retail for the purpose of resale 12 13 within a theme or amusement park owned and operated by the brewery or a parent, subsidiary or a company under common control of such brewery, or upon property of such brewery or a parent, 14 subsidiary or a company under common control of such brewery contiguous to such premises, or in a 15 development contiguous to such premises owned and operated by such brewery or a parent, subsidiary 16 17 or a company under common control of such brewery; and (iii) persons outside the Commonwealth for resale outside the Commonwealth. Such license shall also authorize the licensee to sell at retail the 18 19 brands of beer that the brewery owns at premises described in the brewery license for on-premises 20 consumption and in closed containers for off-premises consumption, provided that not less than 20 21 percent of the volume of beer sold for on-premises consumption in any calendar year is manufactured 22 on the licensed premises.

23 Such license may also authorize individuals holding a brewery license to (a) operate a facility 24 designed for and utilized exclusively for the education of persons in the manufacture of beer, including 25 sampling by such individuals of beer products, within a theme or amusement park located upon the 26 premises occupied by such brewery, or upon property of such person contiguous to such premises, or in 27 a development contiguous to such premises owned and operated by such person or a wholly owned 28 subsidiary or (b) offer samples of the brewery's products to individuals visiting the licensed premises, 29 provided that such samples shall be provided only to individuals for consumption on the premises of 30 such facility or licensed premises and only to individuals to whom such products may be lawfully sold.

31 2. Limited brewery licenses, to breweries that manufacture no more than 15,000 barrels of beer per 32 calendar year, provided that (i) the brewery is located on a farm in the Commonwealth on land zoned 33 agricultural and owned or leased by such brewery or its owner and (ii) agricultural products, including 34 barley, other grains, hops, or fruit, used by such brewery in the manufacture of its beer are grown on the farm. The licensed premises shall be limited to the portion of the farm on which agricultural 35 products, including barley, other grains, hops, or fruit, used by such brewery in the manufacture of its 36 37 beer are grown and that is contiguous to the premises of such brewery where the beer is manufactured, 38 exclusive of any residence and the curtilage thereof. However, the Board may, with notice to the local 39 governing body in accordance with the provisions of § 4.1-230, also approve other portions of the farm 40 to be included as part of the licensed premises. For purposes of this subdivision, "land zoned 41 agricultural" means (a) land zoned as an agricultural district or classification or (b) land otherwise 42 permitted by a locality for limited brewery use. For purposes of this subdivision, "land zoned agricultural" does not include land zoned "residential conservation." Except for the limitation on land 43 zoned "residential conservation," nothing in this definition shall otherwise limit or affect local zoning 44 45 authority.

46 Limited brewery licensees shall be treated as breweries for all purposes of this title except as 47 otherwise provided in this subdivision.

3. Bottlers' licenses, which shall authorize the licensee to acquire and receive deliveries and
shipments of beer in closed containers and to bottle, sell and deliver or ship it, in accordance with
Board regulations to (i) wholesale beer licensees for the purpose of resale, (ii) owners of boats registered
under the laws of the United States sailing for ports of call of a foreign country or another state, and
(iii) persons outside the Commonwealth for resale outside the Commonwealth.

4. Wholesale beer licenses, which shall authorize the licensee to acquire and receive deliveries and
shipments of beer and to sell and deliver or ship the beer from one or more premises identified in the
license, in accordance with Board regulations, in closed containers to (i) persons licensed under this
chapter to sell such beer at wholesale or retail for the purpose of resale, (ii) owners of boats registered

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under the laws of the United States sailing for ports of call of a foreign country or another state, and 57 58 (iii) persons outside the Commonwealth for resale outside the Commonwealth.

59 No wholesale beer licensee shall purchase beer for resale from a person outside the Commonwealth 60 who does not hold a beer importer's license unless such wholesale beer licensee holds a beer importer's 61 license and purchases beer for resale pursuant to the privileges of such beer importer's license.

62 5. Beer importers' licenses, which shall authorize persons licensed within or outside the Commonwealth to sell and deliver or ship beer into the Commonwealth, in accordance with Board 63 64 regulations, in closed containers, to persons in the Commonwealth licensed to sell beer at wholesale for 65 the purpose of resale. 66

6. Retail on-premises beer licenses to:

67 a. Hotels, restaurants, and clubs, which shall authorize the licensee to sell beer, either with or without 68 meals, only in dining areas and other designated areas of such restaurants, or in dining areas, private guest rooms, and other designated areas of such hotels or clubs, for consumption only in such rooms 69 and areas. For purposes of this subdivision, "other designated areas" includes outdoor dining areas, 70 71 whether or not contiguous to the licensed premises, which may have more than one means of ingress and egress to an adjacent public thoroughfare, provided that such outdoor dining areas are under the 72 73 control of the licensee and approved by the Board. Such noncontiguous designated areas shall not be 74 approved for any retail license issued pursuant to subdivision A 5 of § 4.1-201.

75 b. Persons operating dining cars, buffet cars, and club cars of trains, which shall authorize the 76 licensee to sell beer, either with or without meals, in the dining cars, buffet cars, and club cars so 77 operated by them for on-premises consumption when carrying passengers.

78 c. Persons operating sight-seeing boats, or special or charter boats, which shall authorize the licensee 79 to sell beer, either with or without meals, on such boats operated by them for on-premises consumption 80 when carrying passengers.

81 d. Grocery stores located in any town or in a rural area outside the corporate limits of any city or 82 town, which shall authorize the licensee to sell beer for on-premises consumption in such establishments. No license shall be granted unless it appears affirmatively that a substantial public demand for such 83 84 licensed establishment exists and that public convenience and the purposes of this title will be promoted 85 by granting the license.

e. Persons operating food concessions at coliseums, stadia, or similar facilities, which shall authorize 86 87 the licensee to sell beer, in paper, plastic, or similar disposable containers or in single original metal 88 cans, during the performance of professional sporting exhibitions, events or performances immediately 89 subsequent thereto, to patrons within all seating areas, concourses, walkways, concession areas, and 90 additional locations designated by the Board in such coliseums, stadia, or similar facilities, for 91 on-premises consumption. Upon authorization of the licensee, any person may keep and consume his 92 own lawfully acquired alcoholic beverages on the premises in all areas and locations covered by the 93 license.

94 f. Persons operating food concessions at any outdoor performing arts amphitheater, arena or similar facility which has seating for more than 3,500 persons and is located in Albemarle, Augusta, Pittsylvania, Nelson, or Rockingham Counties. Such license shall authorize the licensee to sell beer 95 96 97 during the performance of any event, in paper, plastic or similar disposable containers or in single original metal cans, to patrons within all seating areas, concourses, walkways, concession areas, or 98 99 similar facilities, for on-premises consumption. Upon authorization of the licensee, any person may keep 100 and consume his own lawfully acquired alcoholic beverages on the premises in all areas and locations 101 covered by the license.

102 g. Persons operating food concessions at exhibition or exposition halls, convention centers or similar 103 facilities located in any county operating under the urban county executive form of government or any 104 city which is completely surrounded by such county, which shall authorize the licensee to sell beer 105 during the event, in paper, plastic or similar disposable containers or in single original metal cans, to 106 patrons or attendees within all seating areas, exhibition areas, concourses, walkways, concession areas, 107 and such additional locations designated by the Board in such facilities, for on-premises consumption. 108 Upon authorization of the licensee, any person may keep and consume his own lawfully acquired 109 alcoholic beverages on the premises in all areas and locations covered by the license. For purposes of this subsection, "exhibition or exposition halls" and "convention centers" mean facilities conducting 110 private or public trade shows or exhibitions in an indoor facility having in excess of 100,000 square feet 111 112 of floor space.

113 7. Retail off-premises beer licenses, which shall authorize the licensee to sell beer in closed 114 containers for off-premises consumption.

115 8. Retail off-premises brewery licenses to persons holding a brewery license which shall authorize the licensee to sell beer at the place of business designated in the brewery license, in closed containers 116 which shall include growlers and other reusable containers, for off-premises consumption. 117

9. Retail on-and-off premises beer licenses to persons enumerated in subdivisions 6 a and 6 d, which
shall accord all the privileges conferred by retail on-premises beer licenses and in addition, shall
authorize the licensee to sell beer in closed containers for off-premises consumption.

121 B. Any farm winery or limited brewery that, prior to July 1, 2016, (i) holds a valid license granted 122 by the Board in accordance with this title and (ii) is in compliance with the local zoning ordinance as an 123 agricultural district or classification or as otherwise permitted by a locality for farm winery or limited 124 brewery use shall be allowed to continue such use as provided in § 15.2-2307, notwithstanding (a) the 125 provisions of this section or (b) a subsequent change in ownership of the farm winery or limited 126 brewery on or after July 1, 2016, whether by transfer, acquisition, inheritance, or other means. Any such 127 farm winery or limited brewery located on land zoned residential conservation prior to July 1, 2016 may 128 expand any existing building or structure and the uses thereof so long as specifically approved by the 129 locality by special exception. Any such farm winery or limited brewery located on land zoned residential 130 conservation prior to July 1, 2016 may construct a new building or structure so long as specifically 131 approved by the locality by special exception. All such licensees shall comply with the requirements of 132 this title and Board regulations for renewal of such license or the issuance of a new license in the event 133 of a change in ownership of the farm winery or limited brewery on or after July 1, 2016.

134 2. That the provisions of this act shall become effective on January 1, 2019.

135 3. The provisions of this act shall become effective on April 30, 2022, for a brewery which has
136 entered into: 1) a Performance Agreement with the Commonwealth of Virginia Development
137 Opportunity Fund, on or about April 20, 2016; 2) a Performance Agreement entitled "Regarding

138 Operation Period Economic Development Grant", on or about April 20, 2016, and 3) a 139 commercial lease agreement, on or about April 14, 2017.

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
