Patrons-Peake, Dunnavant, McDougle, Sturtevant, Suetterlein and McClellan; Delegates: Edmunds, Kory and Ware 7 8 Referred to Committee on Education and Health 9 10 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia: 1. That § 22.1-298.1 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows: 11 § 22.1-298.1. Regulations governing licensure. 12 13 A. As used in this section: 14 "Alternate route to licensure" means a nontraditional route to teacher licensure available to individuals who meet the criteria specified in the regulations issued by the Board of Education. 15 "Industry certification credential" means an active career and technical education credential that is 16 17 earned by successfully completing a Board of Education-approved industry certification examination, being issued a professional license in the Commonwealth, or successfully completing an occupational 18 19 competency examination. 20"Licensure by reciprocity" means a process used to issue a license to an individual coming into the 21 Commonwealth from another state when that individual meets certain conditions specified in the Board 22 of Education's regulations. 23 "Professional teacher's assessment" means those tests mandated for licensure as prescribed by the 24 Board of Education. 25 "Provisional license" means a nonrenewable license issued by the Board of Education for a specified 26 period of time, not to exceed three years or, for a critical shortage area provisional license, five years, 27 to an individual who may be employed by a school division in the Commonwealth and who generally 28 meets the requirements specified in the Board of Education's regulations for licensure, but who may 29 need to take additional coursework or pass additional assessments to be fully licensed with a renewable 30 license. 31 "Renewable license" means a license issued by the Board of Education for five years to an individual 32 who meets the requirements specified in the Board of Education's regulations. 33 B. The Board of Education shall prescribe, by regulation, the requirements for the licensure of teachers and other school personnel required to hold a license. Such regulations shall include 34 35 requirements for the denial, suspension, cancellation, revocation, and reinstatement of licensure and 36 procedures for the immediate and thorough investigation by the division superintendent or his designee of any complaint alleging that a license holder has engaged in conduct that may form the basis for the 37 38 revocation of his license. At a minimum, such procedures for investigations contained in such regulations shall require (i) the division superintendent to petition for the revocation of the license upon 39 40 completing such investigation and finding that there is reasonable cause to believe that the license holder 41 has engaged in conduct that forms the basis for revocation of a license; (ii) the school board to proceed to a hearing on such petition for revocation within 90 days of the mailing of a copy of the petition to 42 the license holder, unless the license holder requests the cancellation of his license in accordance with 43 44 Board regulations; and (iii) the school board to provide a copy of the investigative file and such petition 45 for revocation to the Superintendent of Public Instruction at the time that the hearing is scheduled. The Board of Education shall revoke the license of any person for whom it has received a notice of dismissal or resignation pursuant to subsection F of § 22.1-313 and, in the case of a person who is the 46 47 48 subject of a founded complaint of child abuse or neglect, after all rights to any administrative appeal 49 provided by § 63.2-1526 have been exhausted. Regardless of the authority of any other agency of the 50 Commonwealth to approve educational programs, only the Board of Education shall have the authority 51 to license teachers to be regularly employed by school boards, including those teachers employed to 52 provide nursing education. The Board of Education shall prescribe by regulation the licensure requirements for teachers who 53

teach only online courses, as defined in § 22.1-212.23. Such license shall be valid only for teaching
 online courses. Teachers who hold a five-year renewable license issued by the Board of Education may
 teach online courses for which they are properly endorsed.

57 C. The Board of Education's regulations shall include requirements that a person seeking initial

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**58** licensure:

59 1. Complete professional assessments as prescribed by the Board of Education;

60 2. Complete study in attention deficit disorder;

61 3. Complete study in gifted education, including the use of multiple criteria to identify gifted 62 students; and

63 4. Complete study in methods of improving communication between schools and families and ways64 of increasing family involvement in student learning at home and at school.

**65** D. In addition, such regulations shall include requirements that:

66 1. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license demonstrate proficiency in the use of67 educational technology for instruction;

2. Every person seeking initial licensure and persons seeking licensure renewal as teachers who have
not completed such study shall complete study in child abuse recognition and intervention in accordance
with curriculum guidelines developed by the Board of Education in consultation with the Department of
Social Services that are relevant to the specific teacher licensure routes;

3. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license shall receive professional development in instructional methods tailored to promote student academic progress and effective preparation for the Standards of Learning end-of-course and end-of-grade assessments;

4. Every person seeking renewal of a license shall complete all renewal requirements, including
professional development in a manner prescribed by the Board, except that no person seeking renewal of
a license shall be required to satisfy any such requirement by completing coursework and earning credit
at an institution of higher education;

5. (Effective until September 1, 2017) Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license 79 80 shall provide evidence of completion of certification or training in emergency first aid, cardiopulmonary resuscitation, and the use of automated external defibrillators. The certification or training program shall 81 82 be based on the current national evidence-based emergency cardiovascular care guidelines for cardiopulmonary resuscitation and the use of an automated external defibrillator, such as a program 83 84 developed by the American Heart Association or the American Red Cross. The Board shall provide a 85 waiver for this requirement for any person with a disability whose disability prohibits such person from completing the certification or training; 86

87 5. (Effective September 1, 2017) Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license shall 88 provide evidence of completion of certification or training in emergency first aid, cardiopulmonary 89 resuscitation, and the use of automated external defibrillators. The certification or training program shall 90 (i) be based on the current national evidence-based emergency cardiovascular care guidelines for 91 cardiopulmonary resuscitation and the use of an automated external defibrillator, such as a program 92 developed by the American Heart Association or the American Red Cross, and (ii) include hands-on practice of the skills necessary to perform cardiopulmonary resuscitation. The Board shall provide a 93 94 waiver for this requirement for any person with a disability whose disability prohibits such person from 95 completing the certification or training;

96 6. Every person seeking licensure with an endorsement as a teacher of the blind and visually97 impaired shall demonstrate proficiency in reading and writing Braille;

98 7. Every teacher seeking an initial license in the Commonwealth with an endorsement in the area of career and technical education shall have an industry certification credential in the area in which the teacher seeks endorsement. If a teacher seeking an initial license in the Commonwealth has not attained an industry certification credential in the area in which the teacher seeks endorsement, the Board may, upon request of the employing school division or educational agency, issue the teacher a provisional license to allow time for the teacher to attain such credential;

8. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license shall complete awareness training, provided by the Department of Education, on the indicators of dyslexia, as that term is defined by the Board pursuant to regulations, and the evidence-based interventions and accommodations for dyslexia; and

108 9. Every person seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license with an endorsement as a school counselor shall complete training in the recognition of mental health disorder and behavioral distress, including depression, trauma, violence, youth suicide, and substance abuse.

E. Each local school board or division superintendent may waive for any individual whom it seeks to employ as a career and technical education teacher and who is also seeking initial licensure or renewal of a license with an endorsement in the area of career and technical education any applicable requirement set forth in subsection C or subdivision D 1, 3, 4, 6, or 8.

F. The Board's regulations shall require that initial licensure for principals and assistant principals be contingent upon passage of an assessment as prescribed by the Board.

G. The Board shall establish criteria in its regulations to effectuate the substitution of experiential
 learning for coursework for those persons seeking initial licensure through an alternate route as defined
 in Board regulations.

120 H. Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, the Board (i) may provide for the issuance 121 of a provisional license, valid for a period not to exceed three years, pursuant to subdivision D 7 or to 122 any person who does not meet the requirements of this section or any other requirement for licensure 123 imposed by law and; (ii) shall provide for the issuance of a provisional license, valid for a period not to 124 exceed three years, to any former member of the Armed Forces of the United States or the Virginia 125 National Guard who has received an honorable discharge and has the appropriate level of experience or 126 training but does not meet the requirements for a renewable license; and (iii) shall provide for the 127 issuance of a provisional license, valid for a period not to exceed five years, to any person who does 128 not meet the requirements of this section or any other requirement for licensure imposed by law but who 129 has the appropriate level of experience or training in a critical teacher subject matter shortage area or 130 agrees to teach in a critical teacher geographic area as defined in the Board of Education's Regulations 131 Governing the Determination of Critical Teacher Shortage Areas.

132 I. The Board's licensure regulations shall also provide for licensure by reciprocity:

133 1. With comparable endorsement areas for those individuals holding a valid out-of-state teaching
134 license and national certification from the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards or a
135 nationally recognized certification program approved by the Board of Education. The application for
136 such individuals shall require evidence of such valid licensure and national certification and shall not
137 require official student transcripts;

138 2. For individuals who have obtained a valid out-of-state license, with full credentials and without 139 deficiencies, that is in force at the time the application for a Virginia license is received by the 140 Department of Education. The individual must establish a file in the Department of Education by 141 submitting a complete application packet, which shall include official student transcripts. An assessment of basic skills as provided in § 22.1-298.2 and service requirements shall not be imposed for these 142 143 licensed individuals. Other licensing assessments, as prescribed by the Board of Education, shall be required, but any such individual shall be exempt from any professional teacher's assessment 144 145 requirements, subject to the approval of the division superintendent or the school board in the school 146 division in which such individual is employed; and

147 3. The Board may include other provisions for reciprocity in its regulations.

148 2. That an emergency exists and this act is in force from its passage.
