11	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:
12	1. That § 2.2-3703 of the Code of Virginia is amended and reenacted as follows:
13	§ 2.2-3703. Public bodies and records to which chapter inapplicable; voter registration and
13	election records; access by persons incarcerated in a state, local, or federal correctional facility.
15	A. The provisions of this chapter shall not apply to:
15 16	
17	1. The Virginia Parole Board, except that (i) information from the Virginia Parole Board providing the number of inmates considered by the Board for discretionary parole, the number of inmates granted
18	or denied parole, and the number of parolees returned to the custody of the Department of Corrections
19 20	solely as a result of a determination by the Board of a violation of parole shall be open to inspection
20	and available for release, on a monthly basis, as provided by 2.2-3704; (ii) all guidance documents, as defined in 2.2.4101, shall be public records and subject to the provisions of this shorter and (iii) all
21	defined in § 2.2-4101, shall be public records and subject to the provisions of this chapter; and (iii) all
22	records concerning the finances of the Virginia Parole Board shall be public records and subject to the
23	provisions of this chapter. The information required by clause (i) shall be furnished by offense, sex,
24	race, age of the inmate, and the locality in which the conviction was obtained, upon the request of the
25	party seeking the information. The information required by clause (ii) shall include all documents
26	establishing the policy of the Board or any change in or clarification of such policy with respect to
27	grant, denial, deferral, revocation, or supervision of parole or geriatric release or the process for
28	consideration thereof, and shall be clearly and conspicuously posted on the Board's website. However,
29 20	such information shall not include any portion of any document reflecting the application of any policy
30 21	or policy change or clarification of such policy to an individual inmate;
31	2. Petit juries and grand juries;
32	3. Family assessment and planning teams established pursuant to § 2.2-5207;
33 34	4. The Virginia State Crime Commission; and 5. The records required by law to be maintained by the clerks of the courts of record, as defined in

35 36	§ 1-212, and courts not of record, as defined in § 16.1-69.5. However, other records maintained by the clorks of such courts shall be public records and subject to the provisions of this chapter ; and
