18 WHEREAS, Bill Lechler also served as finance committee chair for the Virginia Veterans Services
 19 Foundation Board of Trustees and was an active member of the Japan-Virginia Society and the
 20 Freemasons; and

WHEREAS, in recognition of his long service to the Commonwealth, Bill Lechler received the
 prestigious Patrick Henry Award from Governor Jim Gilmore in 2001; and

WHEREAS, an avid outdoorsman, Bill Lechler was happiest when hunting, fishing, horseback riding,and boating or spending time traveling with family and friends; and

WHEREAS, predeceased by his first wife, Jane, Bill Lechler will be fondly remembered by his wife,
Nancy; his children, Lore, John, and Laura, and their families; and countless other family members,
friends, and former colleagues; now, therefore, be it
