**3. Committee:** Agriculture, Chesapeake and Natural Resources

**4. Title:** Nonresident youth fishing license; exemption.

**5. Summary:** This bill authorizes a nonresident under age 16 to fish without a fishing license or a trout license when accompanied by a person possessing a valid license to fish in Virginia. Current law allows a resident under age 16 or a nonresident under age 12 to fish without a license, except for trout.

**6. Budget Amendment Necessary:** No.

**7. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** Preliminary, see item 8.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** It is anticipated that this bill will result in a nominal fiscal impact for the Department of Game and Inland Fisheries (DGIF), as it could result in loss of revenue generated from the sales of nonresident 1-day freshwater fishing permits and nonresident trout permits to youth under 16 years of age. Approximately \$592 and \$3,478 in revenue was generated in FY17 from the sales of nonresident youth fishing and trout permits, respectively.
