4. Title: Maximum class sizes; grades four through six.
5. Summary: Reduces from 35 to 29 the maximum class size in grades four through six.
6. Budget Amendment Necessary: Yes, Item 136.
7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Preliminary. See Item 8.
8. Fiscal Implications: To reduce from 35 to 29 the maximum class size in grades four through six, the Department of Education calculates a state cost of \$6.1 million in FY 2019 and $\$ 6.2$ million in FY 2020.

Local school divisions would be required to provide the local share of any additional state funds based on each division's local composite index; however, some divisions already may be meeting these maximum class sizes and, therefore, would have no additional costs. Furthermore, there could be a cost to localities to construct additional classroom space to accommodate additional teachers and smaller class sizes; therefore, the reduction in maximum class sizes could create capital costs for localities. Any actual cost to localities is indeterminate.
