Law enforcement officers; employees of the Department of Forensic Science, Office of the Chief Medical Examiner, the Department of General Services Division of Consolidated Laboratory Services; and firefighters may, under protocols developed by the Board of Pharmacy, possess and administer naloxone to persons who are believed to be experiencing or about to experience a life-threatening opioid overdose.
