1.	Title:	Suspected adult abuse, neglect, or exploitation; mandated reporting, vulnerable adults						
5.	Summary: The substitute bill requires the reporting of suspected abuse, neglect, or exploitation of any vulnerable adult. Currently, reporting is required in cases of suspected abuse neglect or exploitation of an adult who is (i) 60 years of age or older or (ii) 18 years							

- of age or older and incapacitated. The bill also directs the Department of Aging and Rehabilitative Services to develop a definition of "vulnerable adult" and to report its recommendation regarding such definition to the Chairmen of the House Committee on Health, Welfare and Institutions and the Senate Committee on Rehabilitation and Social Services by December 1, 2018. Except for the reporting requirement, the bill has a delayed effective date of July 1, 2020.

- **8. Fiscal Implications:** The proposed legislation adds the term "vulnerable" to the adult population being protected under §63.2-1606 and adds a second enactment clause directing Department of Social Services (DSS) to define the term "vulnerable adult" for the purposes of mandated reporting of suspected abuse, neglect, or exploitation. It is expected that the definition of vulnerable adult ultimately adopted would not have any significant fiscal impact on affected agencies. However, should the definition somehow significantly broaden the scope of adult protective services investigations, there could be an impact on local DSS staffing due to increased caseloads.
