The bill requires the Department of Elections to prescribe procedures for the addition of persons registered under the provisions of the bill to the lists of registered voters.

8.	Fiscal Implications: This bill would require an update to Virginia Election and Registration Information System (VERIS) registration forms, reports, and other VERIS functionality to reflect the addition of voters in the system in cases where a person becomes a naturalized citizen after the close of registration records. The Department of Elections estimates the cost of these updates to be \$8,814: \$2,500 for changes to VERIS; \$2,200 for changes to forms, web materials, and guidance documents; and \$4,114 to print and distribute new forms.				
	As stand-alone legislation, the Department of Elections considers implementation of this bill as "routine," and does not require additional funding. However, the Department of Elections will review all electoral legislation likely to be enacted prior to the passage by each house. If the aggregate number of "routine" bills likely to pass either house is unusually large, it is possible that the Department of Elections will require additional resources. If so, the Department of Elections will identify the costs at that time.
