**2. Patron:** Hayes

**3. Committee:** Commerce and Labor

**4. Title:** Health insurance; coverage for limited drug refills.

**5. Summary:** Requires health benefit plans to cover a limited refill for up to a five days' supply of a Schedule VI drug that is dispensed by a pharmacist for a covered person whose dispensed drugs are lost, destroyed, or otherwise rendered unusable as a consequence of a natural or man-made disaster that displaces the person from his residence.

**6. Budget amendment necessary:** No

**7. Fiscal Impact Estimates:** No Fiscal Impact on the State Corporation Commission. For the Department of Human Resource Management (DHRM), the fiscal impact estimate is unknown. See Item 8.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** No fiscal implications on the State Corporation Commission. However, according to the Department of Human Resource Management, the fiscal impact to the state employee health plan is indeterminate, but barring a catastrophic natural or man-made disaster, DHRM does not anticipate the fiscal impact to be significant.

**9. Specific agency or political subdivisions affected:** State Corporation Commission Bureau of Insurance; Department of Human Resource Management

**10. Technical amendment necessary:** No

**11. Other comments:** House Bill 185 applies to any health benefit plan amended, renewed or delivered on or after January 1, 2019 that provides coverage for prescription drugs on an outpatient basis. House Bill 185 is identical to Senate Bill 23.
