**8. Fiscal Implications:** The bill's first enactment clause authorizes the Department of Motor Vehicles to issue two separate special license plate types: a standard \$10 special license plate for supporters of stopping gun violence and a \$25 revenue-sharing special plate for supporters of stopping gun violence. The additional \$15 of the \$25 revenue-sharing special license plate fees will be directed to the Behavioral Health and Developmental Services Fund supporting mental health and substance abuse services at the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services. The second enactment calls for the provisions authorizing a standard \$10 special plate to expire on July 1, 2020. The third enactment requires the revenue-sharing special license plate authorization language to become effective on July 1, 2020.

The Department of Motor Vehicles will incur costs of \$9,376 for information systems programming for the two new plates that will be recouped through special license plate sales.
