2. Patron: Roxann L. Robinson

3. Committee: Passed both Houses

4. Title: Sexual harassment training; legislative branch.

5. Summary: Requires General Assembly members, full-time legislative staff of General Assembly members compensated with state appropriations, and full-time employees of each legislative branch agency to complete sexual harassment training. The bill requires the Clerk of the House of Delegates and the Clerk of the Senate to maintain records for members elected to the House of Delegates and the Senate, respectively, completing the sexual harassment training course. The bill directs that each agency head in the legislative branch be responsible for ensuring that the agency's full-time employees complete the training as required. The bill has a delayed effective date of January 1, 2019.
