4. Title: Riparian planting grounds lease; eligibility.

5. Summary: This measure reduces from 205 feet to 105 feet the minimum low-water shorefront that makes the landowner eligible to apply for a riparian planting grounds assignment by the Commissioner of the Marine Resources Commission. This bill also describes how such assignment may be used or transferred.
