2. Patron: Pogge

3. Committee: Courts of Justice

4. Title: Breach of personal information notification; unreasonable delay.

5. Summary: Defines the term "unreasonable delay" as a period not to exceed 30 days for purposes of the disclosure requirements imposed upon a person or entity that owns or licenses computerized data that includes personal information when there is a security breach involving such information. Currently, the term is undefined.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: No state fiscal impact.

8. Fiscal Implications: Current law provides that following the discovery of a security breach involving personal information, notification of the breach must be provided to the Office of the Attorney General and any affected resident of the Commonwealth without unreasonable delay. This bill defines "unreasonable delay" as a period not to exceed 30 days. The Virginia Information Technologies Agency indicates that establishing the notification period as 30 days does not create a fiscal impact.
