4. Title: Human trafficking

5. Summary:

Current law directs the Department of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) to develop training standards and model policies regarding human trafficking and the identification of victims of human trafficking. The proposed legislation would make these training standards compulsory for law-enforcement agencies. It would also require DCJS to establish an advisory committee to assist in the development of these standards.

8. Fiscal Implications:

The proposed legislation would not have a fiscal impact on DCJS. The agency is currently required to develop these training standards.
