5. Summary: Extends eligibility to participate in programs of preparation and instruction to take a high school equivalency examination approved by the Board of Education to individuals who are at least 16 years of age. This bill has technical amendments.

8. Fiscal Implications: There is no anticipated state fiscal impact resulting from the provisions of this bill. Individuals who are at least 16 years of age already have the opportunity to take the high school equivalency examination approved by the Board of Education. In order for these 16 year olds to test, however, they must meet specific eligibility requirements addressed in § 22.1-254.2, Code of Virginia.
