8.	Fiscal Implications: The language modifications made by this bill should provide judges with more options to address noncompliance with the compulsory attendance statute. As a result of the Virginia Supreme Court's ruling in Blake v. Commonwealth, school divisions could charge noncompliant parents or guardians under § 18.2-371, which carries possible jail time. The proposed legislation could result in a cost avoidance if the state is not required to
