- **8. Fiscal Implications:** The bill eliminates the requirement to publish announcements of Requests for Proposals (RFPs) for professional services in newspapers. Any impact is indeterminate and would depend on whether public bodies choose to continue to publish such announcements in newspapers and publishing costs. Data from the Department of General Services (DGS) indicates 510 out of a total of total of 1,747 RFPs published by state agencies in fiscal year 2017 were categorized as professional services. For illustration purposes, the last RFP published by DGS was approximately \$70; however, publishing costs depend on factors such as the size of the ad.
- **9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected:** All public bodies, unless the body has received an exemption from the Virginia Public Procurement Act, such as through the Higher Education Restructuring Act or the Appropriation Act.
