3. Committee: Passed Both Houses.

4. Title: Pet shops; local ordinance; bond for out-of-state breeder.

5. Summary: This bill authorizes any local governing body to adopt an ordinance that requires any pet shop or dealer in companion animals to furnish a bond of as much as \$5,000 for a pet shop maintaining for sale an average of 50 or fewer dogs per year and not more than \$30,000 for a pet shop maintaining for sale an average of 51 or more dogs per year. The bill also provides conditions by which localities may waive and/or terminate the bond requirement of a pet shop.
