4. Title: Public procurement; agreements with labor organizations.

5. Summary: This bill repeals provisions requiring state agencies to ensure that neither the state agency nor any construction manager acting on behalf of the state agency, in its bid specifications, project agreements, or other controlling documents relating to the operation, erection, construction, alteration, improvement, maintenance, or repair of any public facility of public works, (i) requires or prohibits bidders, offerors, contractors, or subcontractors to enter into or adhere to agreements with one or more labor organizations, on the same or related projects, or (ii) discriminates against bidders, offerors, contractors, subcontractors, or operators for becoming or refusing to become or remain signatories or otherwise to adhere to agreements with one or more labor organizations, on the same or related public works projects.

8. Fiscal Implications: This bill repeals § 2.2-4321.2, Code of Virginia. This may result in an indeterminate decrease in the workload of procurement officers on the procurement of public works contracts that is currently associated with ensuring bid specifications, project agreements and other controlling documents for such procurements adhere to the provisions of § 2.2-4321.2.

9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected: All public bodies subject to the Virginia Public Procurement Act (VPPA) except for counties, cities or towns.
