4.	<b>Title:</b> Dissemination of juvenile record information; emergency medical services agency applicants.
5.	<b>Summary:</b> Provides that juvenile record information maintained in the Central Criminal Records Exchange may be disseminated (i) to the State Health Commissioner or his designed for the purpose of screening any person who applies to be a volunteer with or an employee of an emergency medical services agency and (ii) to the chief law-enforcement officer of a locality, or his designee who shall be an individual employed as a public safety official of the locality, that has adopted an ordinance to conduct investigations of employment applicants for the purpose of screening any person who applies to be a volunteer with or an employee of an emergency medical services agency. This bill incorporates SB 118 and SB 122.

7.	No Fiscal Impact.
8.	<b>Fiscal Implications:</b> This bill would not have a fiscal impact on the Commonwealth. The dissemination of juvenile record information maintained in the Central Criminal Records Exchange to the Office of Emergency Medical Services (OEMS) for the purpose of screening any person who applies to be a volunteer or employee with an Emergency Medical Services agency would not have a fiscal impact on the Virginia Department of Health (VDH). VDH already performs these services and the juvenile record information will actually be a benefit to OEMS in this process. This bill would not have a fiscal impact on the Virginia State Police.
