- **8.** Fiscal Implications: This bill specifically lists the African-American Burial Ground for the Enslaved at Belmont, with a total of 44 eligible graves. Based on the number of graves and the \$5.00 minimal payment for each, the estimated fiscal impact to the general fund would be at least \$220 per year. The fiscal impact of providing funding equal to the average actual cost of routine maintenance is indeterminate. Budget language in paragraphs J.1 and 2 of Item 374 in HB/SB30, as Introduced, references funding for the support of the preservation and care of historical African American graves.
