**3. Committee:** Education and Health

**4. Title:** School boards; employment of certain individuals.

**5. Summary:** Prohibits any school board from employing any individual who has been convicted of any felony offense against a child; a certain act of violence or violent felony; any offense involving the sexual molestation, physical or sexual abuse, or rape of a child; or any offense for which registration is required. For any other felony offense, permits the school board, in its discretion, to hire an individual who has had his civil rights restored by the Governor and at least five years have passed since such conviction.

**8. Fiscal Implications:** There is no anticipated state fiscal impact resulting from the provisions of this bill. Any fiscal impact to localities is indeterminate.
