4. Title: Weekend jail time

5. Summary: Allows courts, for good cause and absent of objection by the Commonwealth, to impose nonconsecutive or weekend jail time for defendants convicted of a misdemeanor, traffic offense or felony that is not an act of violence provided that the active portion of the sentence remaining to be served is 45 days or less.

8. Fiscal Implications: The state reimburses localities a portion of the cost of housing offenders in local and regional jails through a per diem payment for each offender. The proposed legislation would not change the per diem amount or affect the total number of days any offender would be housed in a local or regional jail. Therefore, it would not have any fiscal impact on the state.
