3. Committee: General Laws and Technology

4. Title: Virginia Public Procurement Act; local preference for businesses participating in Virginia Register.

5. Summary: Authorizes a locality to develop and implement a bidding system that gives preference to the lowest responsive and responsible bidder who (i) is a resident of Virginia and (ii) participates in the Virginia Registered Apprenticeship program administered by the Department of Labor and Industry.

6. Budget Amendment Necessary: No.

7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Preliminary; fiscal impact is indeterminate.

8. Fiscal Implications: The impact of the bill is indeterminate. The bill would allow localities to give preference to bidders residing in Virginia and participating in the Virginia Registered Apprenticeship program. The preference allowed by this bill for Virginia bidders could potentially lead other states to reciprocate against Virginia businesses with like in-state programs, according to the Department of General Services. If reciprocity is imposed on Virginia businesses by other states, it could affect out-of-state sales.

9. Specific Agency or Political Subdivisions Affected: All localities that have not adopted alternative procurement regulations.
