4.	Title:	State School Health Advisory Board; established, report.					

- **5. Summary:** Establishes the State School Health Advisory Board in the executive branch to advise the General Assembly and the Governor on pending or proposed legislation concerning the role of employees in public elementary or secondary schools in providing health care services at such schools and provide guidance on any associated training requirements. The provisions of this bill are contingent upon an appropriation.

- 7. Fiscal Impact Estimates: Preliminary. See Item 8.
- **8. Fiscal Implications:** This bill creates a State School Health Advisory Board consisting of two legislative members, 10 nonlegislative citizen members, and two ex officio members. Nonlegislative citizen members will not receive compensation for their services; however, pursuant to Item 1 of the 2017 Appropriation Act, each General Assembly member appointed to the State School Health Advisory Board will be compensated at a rate equal to \$300 for each day, or portion thereof, of attendance at a State School Health Advisory Board meeting. In addition, all Board members must be reimbursed for all reasonable and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties. The Department of Education (DOE) is required to fund the cost of State School Health Advisory Board member expenses.

Based on the FY 2018 rates provided in the Commonwealth Accounting Policies and Procedures Manual, DOE could incur additional costs estimated between \$17,000 - \$27,000 per year to reimburse members of the State School Health Advisory Board. This estimate is based on the minimum and maximum lodging and meals and incidental expenses allowances and estimated mileage of 200 miles per day per member at the 2018 Internal Revenue Service standard mileage rate. The estimate assumes that the Advisory Board will meet four times per year; however, the bill states that the Board shall meet at such times as it deems appropriate or on call of the chairman, which could result in additional agency expenses.
