4. Title: Handheld photo speed monitoring devices

5. Summary: This bill provides that a law-enforcement officer may operate a handheld photo speed monitoring device, defined in the bill, in or around a school crossing zone for the purpose of recording images of vehicles that are traveling at speeds of at least 12 miles per hour above the posted school crossing zone speed limit within such school crossing zone when such school crossing zone is indicated by appropriately placed signs displaying the maximum speed limit and the use of such handheld automated speed monitoring device. Only civil penalties of up to \$125 can be assessed, with no impact on a driver's record unless the law enforcement officer issues the summons personally to a violator.

8. Fiscal Implications: The Department of Motor Vehicles anticipates no fiscal impact to the state from this bill. All civil penalties generated from the provisions of this legislation are to be retained by localities where the summons is issued.
