Commending Dan McMillan, M.D.

WHEREAS, for more than five decades, Dan McMillan, M.D., has served and cared for women in Augusta County as an obstetrician/gynecologist; and

WHEREAS, Dr. McMillan began his career as a physician in Staunton in 1982; he later became the owner of his own practice, now known as Augusta Health Care for Women; and

WHEREAS, in 1995, the practice relocated to the newly opened Augusta Medical Center, and in May 2005, Dr. McMillan's vision of a free-standing state-of-the-art facility became a reality when he opened a newly constructed office in Fishersville; and

WHEREAS, Dr. McMillan has grown the practice from a single practitioner to a business that now employs 40 doctors, midwives, nurses, and support staff, and has served countless women in Augusta County and throughout the region; and

WHEREAS, under Dr. McMillan's leadership, Augusta Health Care for Women has offered the highest-quality medical care, upheld stringent medical ethics, and promoted ongoing advancements in medical procedures, treatment, and prevention; and

WHEREAS, in addition to building a successful women's health practice, Dr. McMillan has displayed extraordinary commitment to his patients by serving nearly 6,000 nights on-call, delivering more than 5,000 babies, and performing thousands of surgeries; and

WHEREAS, throughout his career, Dr. McMillan has demonstrated the highest examples of ethics, morals, and unselfish service; his skill as a physician and surgeon and his leadership in the Augusta County medical community will be missed; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, That Dan McMillan, M.D., hereby be commended on the occasion of his retirement from Augusta Health Care for Women; and, be it
