That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Title 30 a chapter numbered 60, consisting of sections numbered 30-376 through 30-381, as follows: CHAPTER 60. COMMISSION ON STUDENT BEHAVIORAL HEALTH. § 30-376. Commission on Student Behavioral Health; purpose; membership; terms; quorum; expenses. A. The Commission on Student Behavioral Health (the Commission) is hereby established as a

The purpose of the Commission shall be to (i) assess the efficacy of developing and implementing a statewide behavioral health and suicide prevention holline that students may use to report threats of violence or receive real-time counseling services; (ii) review the current school counseling services to students; (iii) review the current roles and responsibilities of school nurses, psychologists, and social workers in schools and determine whether a realignment of responsibilities could improve or streamline services offered to students; (iv) evaluate the efficacy and costs of providing enhanced behavioral health services in schools additivered through partnerships established between school divisions and local departments of social services and community services boards; (v) assess the effectiveness of de-escalation and other alternative disciplinary policies when interacting with students suffering from behavioral health challenges; (ui) examine the value of additional teacher training requirements on student behavioral health, such as mental health first aid; and (vii) examine other topics related to student behavioral health identified by the Commission shall consist of 12 members as follows: seven members of the House of Delegates; and five members of the Bouse Committee on Health, Welfare and Institutions, two shall be members of the House Committee on Education, two shall be members of the Education and Health, two shall be a member at-large, to be appointed by the Senate committee on Finance, and one shall be viewer the majority of the sort experiment. 56 57 58	The Commission shall have the following powers and duties: 1. To study and gather information and data to accomplish its purposes as set forth in § 30-376; 2. To study the operations, management, jurisdiction, powers, and interrelationships of any

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59 department, board, bureau, commission, authority or other agency with any direct responsibility for the 60 provision and delivery of student behavioral health services in the Commonwealth;

61 3. To examine matters relating to student behavioral health services in other states and to consult 62 and exchange information with officers and agencies of other states with respect to student behavioral 63 *health service problems of mutual concern;*

64 4. To maintain offices and hold meetings and functions at any place within the Commonwealth that it 65 deems necessary;

66 5. To invite other interested parties to sit with the Commission and participate in its deliberations;

6. To appoint a special task force from among the members of the Commission to study and make 67 68 recommendations on issues related to student behavioral health care services to the full Commission; 69 and

70 7. To report its recommendations to the General Assembly and the Governor annually and to make 71 such interim reports as it deems advisable or as may be required by the General Assembly and the 72 Governor.

§ 30-378. Staffing.

74 The Commission may appoint, employ, and remove an executive director and such other persons as 75 it deems necessary, and determine their duties and fix their salaries or compensation within the amounts 76 appropriated therefor. The Commission may also employ experts who have special knowledge of the issues before it. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Commission, upon 77 78 request. 79

§ 30-379. Chairman's executive summary of activity and work of the Commission.

80 The chairman of the Commission shall submit to the General Assembly and the Governor an annual executive summary of the interim activity and work of the Commission no later than the first day of 81 each regular session of the General Assembly. The executive summary shall be submitted as provided in 82 83 the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for the processing of legislative 84 documents and reports and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website. 85

§ 30-380. Cooperation of other state agencies and political subdivisions.

86 The Commission may request and shall receive from every department, division, board, bureau, 87 commission, authority, or other agency created by the Commonwealth, or to which the Commonwealth is 88 party, or from any political subdivision of the Commonwealth, cooperation and assistance in the 89 performance of its duties.

90 § 30-381. Sunset.

91 The provisions of this chapter shall expire on July 1, 2021.
