9 10	WHEREAS, the Commonwealth ranks poorly in national ratings of real estate assessment appeal
11 12	practices; and WHEREAS, the prohibitive cost of circuit court appeals limits property owners' and taxpayers' access
13	to justice with respect to real estate taxes, especially for property owners and taxpayers who have
14 15	limited income; and WHEREAS, the Commonwealth could reduce inefficiency, minimize costs to taxpayers, and make
16	tax appeals more fair by establishing a tax court system; now, therefore, be it
17 18	RESOLVED by the House of Delegates, the Senate concurring, That the Office of the Executive Secretary of the Virginia Supreme Court be requested to study options and models for a tax court
19	system in the Commonwealth.
20 21	In conducting its study, the Office of the Executive Secretary shall seek input from local government representatives, property ownership and management associations, the judicial branch, and state and local
22	tax administrators. The Office of the Executive Secretary shall evaluate the tax court systems of other
23 24	states, as well as options and models provided by research organizations. Technical assistance shall be provided to the Office of the Executive Secretary by the Department of
25	Taxation. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Office of the Executive
26 27	Secretary for this study, upon request. The Office of the Executive Secretary shall complete its meetings by November 30, 2019, and shall
