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VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend and reenact §§ 22.1-207.1 and 22.1-207.1:1 of the Code of Virginia, relating to family 3 life education; human trafficking.

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Approved

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

7 1. That §§ 22.1-207.1 and 22.1-207.1:1 of the Code of Virginia are amended and reenacted as 8 follows: 9

§ 22.1-207.1. Family life education.

10 A. As used in this section, "abstinence education" means an educational or motivational component that has as its exclusive purpose teaching the social, psychological, and health gains to be realized by 11 12 teenagers' abstaining from sexual activity before marriage.

B. The Board of Education shall develop Standards of Learning and curriculum guidelines for a 13 14 comprehensive, sequential family life education curriculum in grades kindergarten through 12. Such 15 curriculum guidelines shall include instruction as appropriate for the age of the student in family living and community relationships; the benefits, challenges, responsibilities, and value of marriage for men, 16 women, children, and communities; the value of family relationships; abstinence education; the value of 17 postponing sexual activity; the benefits of adoption as a positive choice in the event of an unwanted 18 19 pregnancy; human sexuality; human reproduction; the prevention of human trafficking; dating violence, 20 the characteristics of abusive relationships, steps to take to deter sexual assault, and the availability of 21 counseling and legal resources, and, in the event of such sexual assault, the importance of immediate 22 medical attention and advice, as well as the requirements of the law; the etiology, prevention, and 23 effects of sexually transmitted diseases; and mental health education and awareness.

24 C. All such instruction shall be designed to promote parental involvement, foster positive 25 self-concepts, and provide mechanisms for coping with peer pressure and the stresses of modern living 26 according to the students' developmental stages and abilities. The Board shall also establish requirements 27 for appropriate training for teachers of family life education, which shall include training in instructional 28 elements to support the various curriculum components. 29

§ 22.1-207.1:1. Family life education; certain curricula and Standards of Learning.

30 A. Any family life education curriculum offered by a local school division shall require the 31 Standards of Learning objectives related to dating violence and the characteristics of abusive 32 relationships to be taught at least once in middle school and at least twice in high school, as described 33 in the Board of Education's family life education guidelines.

34 B. Any high school family life education curriculum offered by a local school division shall 35 incorporate age-appropriate elements of effective and evidence-based programs on the prevention of 36 dating violence, domestic abuse, sexual harassment, including sexual harassment using electronic means, 37 and sexual violence, and human trafficking and may incorporate age-appropriate elements of effective 38 and evidence-based programs on the law and meaning of consent. Such age-appropriate elements of 39 effective and evidence-based programs on the prevention of sexual violence may include instruction that 40 increases student awareness of the fact that consent is required before sexual activity.

41 C. Any family life education curriculum offered in any elementary school, middle school, or high 42 school shall incorporate age-appropriate elements of effective and evidence-based programs on the 43 importance of the personal privacy and personal boundaries of other individuals and tools for a student 44 to use to ensure that he respects the personal privacy and personal boundaries of other individuals.

D. Any family life education curriculum offered by a local school division may incorporate 45 age-appropriate elements of effective and evidence-based programs on the prevention, recognition, and 46 awareness of child abduction, child abuse, child sexual exploitation, and child sexual abuse. 47

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
