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## VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY - CHAPTER

2 An Act to amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Article 3 of Chapter 32 of Title 58.1 a section 3 numbered 58.1-3228.1, relating to partial exemption from real property taxes for flood mitigation 4 efforts.

#### 7 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

8 1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Article 3 of Chapter 32 of Title 58.1 a 9 section numbered 58.1-3228.1 as follows: 10

§ 58.1-3228.1. Partial exemption from real property taxes for flood mitigation efforts.

11 A. As used in this section, unless the context requires a different meaning:

12 "Impervious area" means any man-made area that significantly impedes or prevents natural 13 infiltration of water into the soil, including roofs, buildings, streets, driveways, parking areas, and any concrete, asphalt, or compacted gravel surface. 14

15 "Living shoreline" has the same meaning as provided in § 28.2-104.1.

"Qualifying flood improvements" means flooding abatement, mitigation, or resiliency improvements 16 17 that do not increase the size of any impervious area and are made either to qualifying structures or to 18 land. For improvements made to land, the improvements must be made primarily for the benefit of one 19 or more qualifying structures.

20 "Qualifying structure" means a structure that was completed prior to July 1, 2018 or a structure that 21 was completed more than 10 years prior to the completion of the qualifying flood improvements.

22 B. The governing body of any county, city, or town may, by ordinance, provide a partial tax 23 exemption for improved real estate that is subject to recurrent flooding and upon which qualifying flood 24 improvements have been made. No exemption shall be granted for any improvements made prior to July 25 1, 2018.

26 C. The ordinance may also (i) establish flood protection standards that qualifying flood 27 improvements must meet in order to be eligible for the exemption; (ii) determine the amount of the 28 exemption; (iii) set income or property value limitations regarding eligibility for the exemption; (iv) 29 provide that the exemption shall last for only a specified number of years; (v) determine, based upon 30 flood risk, zones or districts within the locality in which the exemption shall be available, such as those 31 established by the Virginia Flood Risk Information System; and (vi) establish preferred actions that qualify for the exemption, including the use of living shorelines as the preferred alternative for 32 33 stabilizing tidal shorelines in the Commonwealth pursuant to § 28.2-104.1.
