Report. 6 Patron-Boysko 7 8 Referred to Committee on Rules 9 10 WHEREAS, broadband access is an essential component of modern life, delivering important civic and educational benefits and acting as an important driver of economic growth in communities; and 11 WHEREAS, the use of renewable energy has significant environmental and economic benefits, 12 including reducing types of air pollution and creating jobs in manufacturing and installation; and 13 WHEREAS, broadband deployment and renewable energy projects require various permits or 14 15 approvals, often in multiple jurisdictions; and WHEREAS, identifying and sharing best permitting practices, including those addressing fees and 16 rates, application review timeframes, access to the status of permit applications, and associated statutes 17 could be beneficial to local review of proposed projects; now, therefore, be it 18 19 RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the Department of Housing and Community Development be requested to study the permitting processes in the Commonwealth for 20 21 broadband deployment and renewable energy construction projects. The study shall examine ways to 22 streamline the permitting process across the Commonwealth. In conducting its study, the Department of Housing and Community Development (the Department) 23 24 shall identify and make recommendations for streamlining existing fee structures, timelines for permit 25 approval, and procedures for modifying a permit. The Department shall also consider possible advantages and disadvantages of making the permitting process available online. 26 27 Technical assistance shall be provided to the Department by the Center for Innovative Technology. 28 The Department shall consult various stakeholders, including the Center for Innovative Technology, the 29 Governor's Chief Broadband Advisor, the Department of Environmental Quality, the Department of Mines, Minerals and Energy, the Broadband Advisory Council, the Virginia Energy Development and 30 Energy Storage Authority, the Virginia Association of Counties, the Virginia Municipal League, the 31 Virginia Building and Code Officials Association, and the Virginia Association of Planning District 32 33 Commissions. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Department for this 34 study, upon request. 35 The Department shall complete its meetings by November 30, 2019, and shall submit to the 36 Governor and the General Assembly an executive summary and a report of its findings and 37 recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The executive summary and report 38 shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for 39 the processing of legislative documents and reports no later than the first day of the 2020 Regular

Session of the General Assembly and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website. 40



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
