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11 12	WHEREAS, local school divisions throughout the Commonwealth are struggling to recruit and retain high quality teachers; and
13 14	WHEREAS, the teacher workforce in the Commonwealth is becoming more racially homogenous over time; and
14 15 16	WHEREAS, public elementary and secondary school populations continue to grow in both size and racial diversity; and
17	WHEREAS, this growth demands careful consideration of policy changes to address teacher
18	shortages and the lack of teacher diversity in order to best serve the needs of all public school students,
19	especially in light of recent supportive findings such as a study published by the Institute of Labor
20	Economics that concludes that low-income black students who have at least one black teacher in
21 22	elementary school are significantly more likely to graduate high school and consider attending college; and
$\frac{22}{23}$	WHEREAS, it is imperative to identify and eliminate any barriers to a sufficient and diverse teacher
$\overline{24}$	workforce in the Commonwealth; now, therefore, be it
25	RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the Department of Education be
26	requested to study the teacher licensure process and the assessment requirements therein for any inherent
27 28	biases that may prevent minority teacher candidates from entering the profession. In conducting its study, the Department of Education shall review all relevant statutes, regulations,
20 29	and data. Technical assistance shall be provided to the Department of Education by each school board in
30	the Commonwealth. All agencies of the Commonwealth shall provide assistance to the Department of
31	Education for this study, upon request.
32	The Department of Education shall complete its meetings by November 30, 2018, and shall submit to
33	the Governor and the General Assembly an executive summary and a report of its findings and
34 35	recommendations for publication as a House or Senate document. The executive summary and report shall be submitted as provided in the procedures of the Division of Legislative Automated Systems for
36	the processing of legislative documents and reports no later than the first day of the 2019 Regular
37	Session of the General Assembly and shall be posted on the General Assembly's website.
